Do you have a camera?

We're making a photographic mosaic of central Coventry and we want you to participate.

We've drawn a grid over the area and we want contributions - photos - which are taken from within the circles shown on the map.

Once taken, send them to us and we will

- Include them on the Grid Project website at www.thegridproject.org.uk
- Display them in an exhibition at the Warwick Arts Centre in November

What to do

1. Select up to 3 locations from the map overleaf and tell us which you've chosen.
2. Go out and find the location(s).
3. Standing *within the circle* on the map, take one or more photographs
4. Send one photo per location by email ASAP to thegridprojectuk@gmail.com.

Deadline : Sunday 15th August 10.00 pm

Submit one photo per grid location. We'll make them square. If you can make them square yourself that's great. We'll need to know who you are & the grid reference, so include that in your email (eg. *Dave Allen 5G*).

AIMS...

The overall aim is to show, through photographs, the Coventry environment as we *emerge from lockdown*.

How is the place looking?

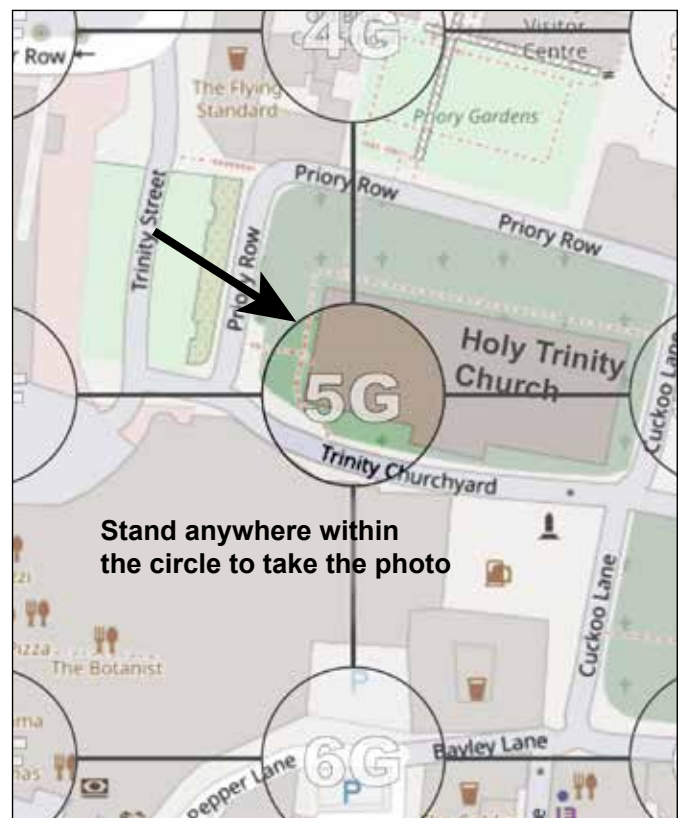
What are we now free to do?

When is this project happening?

Can I take part and select some locations to photograph without attending the presentations in Coventry?

Yes. You can email request for locations. We will reply promptly. You can see the available locations on the list at:

Please note, though, that the first sign-ups will be at the presentations at the Herbert Gallery on Saturday 31st July. Email requests won't be taken before Sunday 1st August.

Can I do some more photos after the first 3 I've signed-up for?

Yes, after your initial 3 photos have been received by The Grid Project, via email. Just email your request for another 3 locations.

Who can take part in this project?

Anyone, including children.

Do I need a good camera to take part?

No. Any digital camera is fine, including mobiles.

What if I can't gain entry to my location?

If your location is inaccessible for any reason, or unsafe to enter, you should take the photo from the nearest accessible place.

My location is in a shop and I've been told not to take a photo there. What should I do?

As above, you should take the photo from the nearest accessible place.

In previous projects this has not been a big issue, but the owners of the premises have a right to disallow photography.

Can I process my photos before I email them to you?

Yes, if you want to. There is no requirement that you process your photos, though.

Can I submit black and white photos?

Yes. Colour or b/w is fine. They should be **square** in format. If you submit a rectangular format we'll do the cropping for you (sensitively).

THE SMALL PRINT

Copyright of the photographs remains with the photographer. By taking part in this project you give your permission for your photos to be displayed on The Grid Project website, social media pages, in an exhibition and any other associated materials. Photographs will always be credited.

Legal: unless you are on a public highway you may not be granted permission to take a photograph. We have no special rights in this respect.
